



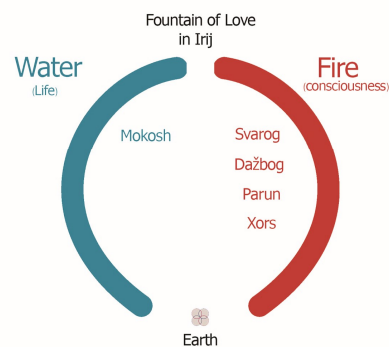
Concept

According to the deepest roots of Slavic culture (mentioned in the attached file), based on the dual pattern of water and fire (life and consciousness), the project concept is formed and all components of the building and its users immerse in the two concepts of life and consciousness.

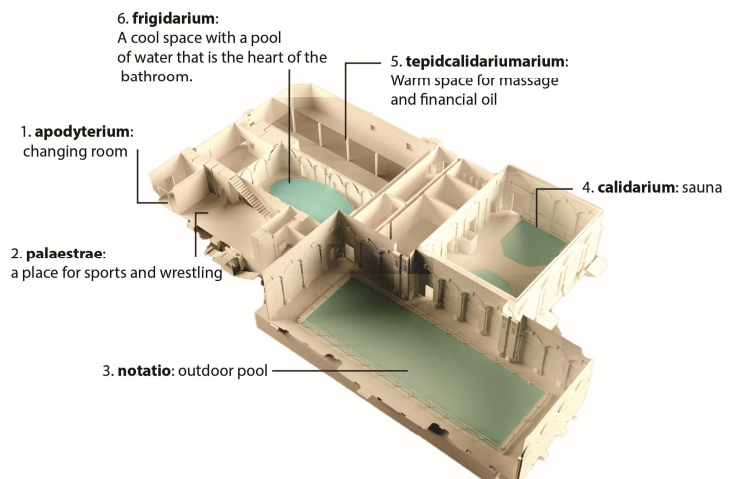
Among the concepts related to the sun (and fire) in Slavic culture, from the four names Svarog, Dažbog, Parun and Xors, we choose the shortest name to form the project concept. Xors as the symbol of the sun and the fountain of love, spreads awareness throughout the city from The highest point of the building. Mokosh, on the other hand, gives life to everything as a symbol of water and the fountain of life.

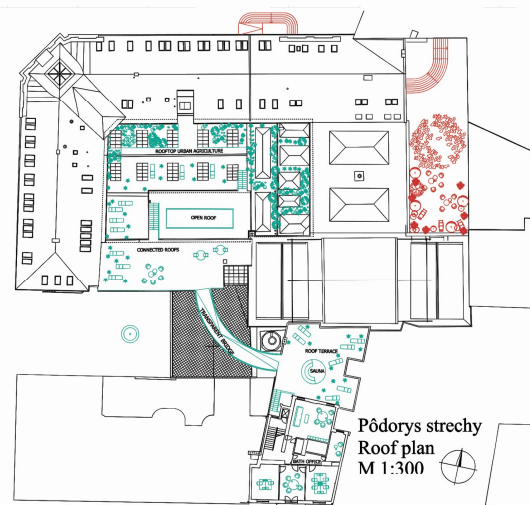
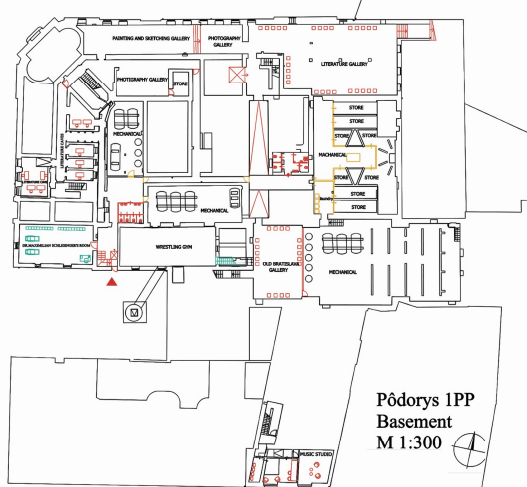
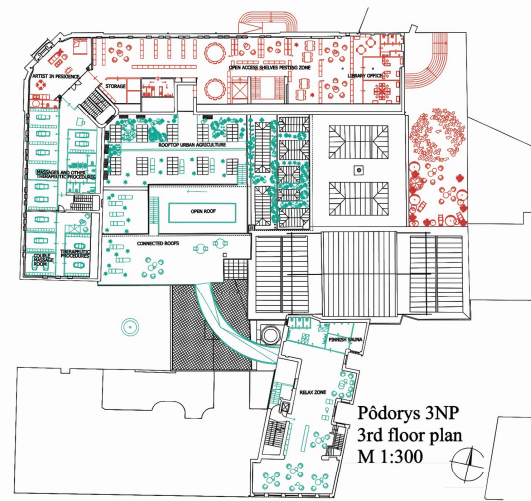
During the day, the sun in the sky is a symbol of Xors, but we use Holographic Projection technology to visualize the sun at night. In this regard, the building's chimney, as a tall urban element, provides us with the extraordinary facilities to use this technology to illuminate a bright sun from the top of the chimney during the night; A sun that can become an international cultural symbol: The Bratislava sun.

as The symmetry of the fountain of love, The Fountain of Life is also located in the form of a fountain in front of the chimney in the southern courtyard to complete the concept of the fountain of fire and the fountain of water, and in the form of awareness and life, that extended in two sections of the library and pool.
